

Questions for Analyzing the Articles: Respond to these questions on a separate sheet of paper and submit at the end of class.

- a. With what lens (vocabulary, perspective, omissions etc.) did you analyze your group's news articles?
- b. What were your observations/findings?
- c. Select several facts/arguments (3 if possible) which led you to these findings.
- d. Is the reportage of this particular news event, in your opinion, true, balanced or biased? Explain.
- e. Are different viewpoints presented? Are any articles an editorial (author's own ideas), are they informative, convincing, and/or balanced?
- f. What are your final thoughts about the news event that your group covered? Explain your understanding of the news event itself.
